## WHAT IS SUSTAINABILITY?

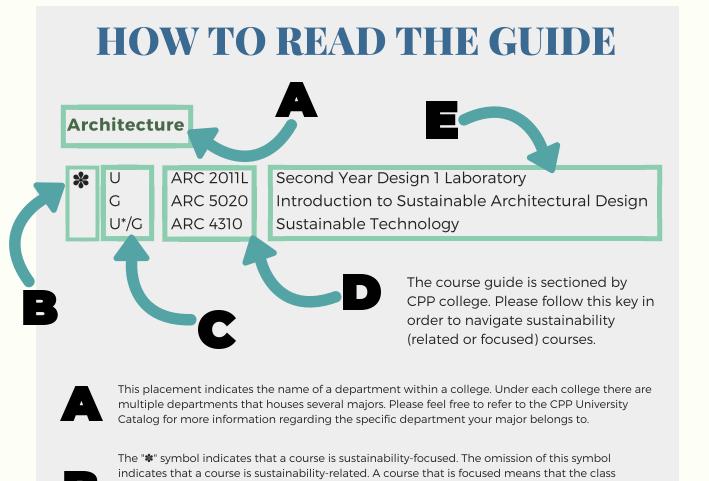
Sustainability is not a term limited to environmental components. It is a holistically broad perspective that encompasses the interconnectedness of society, economics, and political pursuits. Within the scope of Cal Poly Pomona (CPP), sustainability in itself has been a long-term goal that the university continues to cultivate. This course guide is a pivotal part of educating campus members about the multimodal presence of sustainability within the curriculum of all the colleges at CPP.

Sustainability is defined by the United Nations as "meeting the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations." The essential purpose of this guide is to highlight courses offered at Cal Poly Pomona that promote one or more of the concepts above, each course chosen and reviewed by Sustainability Student Assistants, the University Sustainability Coordinator, Department Professors, and Department Heads.



In the Sustainability Course Guide, classes are listed as either **"Sustainability-Focused" (\*)** or **"Sustainability-Related."** Sustainability encompasses a wide range of topics including:


